Brief History of the College:

Rimuli, situated amidst the woodland grace, gives a picturesque surrounding with predominantly inhabited by SC, ST and other economically downtrodden communities who for various reasons Economic, social, geographical etc were hither-to neglected and deprived of the rights of Higher Education until the college was established and fulfilled the long felt earnest desire of the people for the pursued of higher education. In 1982, a few village elders put their heads together to start a college at Rimuli when they found that demand from the public living in and around the area became a proposition of pressing need. In fact they took a very bold step in 1982 towards establishing this college which at present is running 30th year. The college has been affiliated by Utkal University and council of higher secondary education Odisha with Arts faculties teaching English, MIL, History, Political Science, Economics, Sanskrit, Logic, and Mathematics at the intermediate stage with a total strength of 128 students only and started in the local high school. Then the college took a long stride in having its own lands and building and the 3 faculties of Arts, Science and commerce at the +2 level and started functioning right from the year 1984. The foundation stone of the present building was laid down by Sri Gangadhar Mahapatra, the then education minister in 1983. In the year 1986, the College got affiliation from the Utkal University, Vanivihar, Bhubaneswar for opening of new subjects i.e. Psychology, Education, Sociology and SPST at the +2 Arts level. In 1987, +3 BA classes were opened with a total strength of 128 students. In 1993, +3 BSc. classes were opened with a total strength of 64 students. The sanctioned strength of +3 BA increased from 128 to 160 seats and Honours in Political Science with 16 seats were also opened in the same year. Along with the diversification of courses the time and the total sanctioned strength of students has gone up to being taken to open additional subjects i.e. Psychology, Education and Sociology at the +3 BA level and Honours in various subjects. Subsequently Honours teaching facilities in five subjects i.e. Pol. Sc., History, Sanskrit, Chemistry and Zoology were opened. Since 1998, the college has been affiliated to the North Orissa University, Baripada.

Taking into consideration of the increasing demands of the students of the tribal area, the Govt. of Odisha have been pleased to accord permission for opening of Honours subject in Physics, Mathematics and Odia, Opening of +3 Commerce stream with 64 seats and extension of seats in +3 Science stream from 64 seats to 96 seats from the academic session 2011-12.

Alongwith the diversification of courses, the number of seats in various classes have been raised from time to time and the total sanctioned strength of students has gone upto more than 1700 at present . Keeping in view the increasing demands of the students of the area, the college proposes to open additional subjects, Honours in various Arts, Science and Commerce subjects in the coming years.

The outstanding growth of the College is attributed to the donations received from the generous public, industrial sectors, local M.L.As & M.Ps, eminent personalities and the Ex-students from time to time. The College is flourishing because of the grants received from the University Grants

Commission, New Delhi under Basic Assistance and the development Assistance in various plan periods and the necessary aid and assistance from the state Government for its development.

The college aims at all round development of the students by providing opportunities to achieve excellence in all fields. The college has achieved the unique distinction of being one of the foremost colleges of Odisha state by maintain commendable position in respect of academic activities, student discipline, standard teaching, student-teacher relationships, sports and games, youth red cross, Red Ribbon Club, Scout & Guide, NSS. Programmes and also satisfactory performance of students in the council and university examinations. To add to its glory, this college has been accredited by 'NAAC' in the year 2012 for academic excellence.

Further there was unstinted help from the public and donations were made from several quarters of which special mentor may be made of the Rimuli Gram Panchayat, RimuliMela committee, ITDA, Champua, and the students of this college. The college owes as lot to the University Grants Commission, New Delhi, and Govt. of Orissa for their aids and grants for its development.

The former governing body of Rimuli college under the presidentship of Late NakafodiSethy and the active cooperation of Sj. SanatanSahoo, secretary, Sj. Subash Chandra Brahma, treasurer, and members Sri HrusikeshSethy, Sri Sachitra Chandra Mahanta, Sri RatdhakantaDehuryk, Sri Govindach.Naik, Sri AkadasiNaik, Sri SudarsanNaik, Sri. PurusottamPradhan, Sri HaldharBaidya, and teacher representatives Sri Ajaya Kumar Pradhan and Sri Bhubaneswar Mahanta, managed the construction of the college buildings and other development works. Recently, a hostel has been constructed with the grant of the TRW, Department of Govt. of Orissa.

Adding to this the Govt. has been pleased to transfer 9.5 acres of land where the present building has been constructed. PART -B:**1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the Institution:-**

The institution has a goal of becoming the leading premier institution of Orissa especially of North Orissa University, Baripada. In this regard it has taken lot of steps to enhance both curricular and extra-curricular activities by the joint venture and co-operative nature of the existing staff members and students. Besides the above all the departments regularly carry on seminars, debates, competitions, student counseling, remedial classes, unit test & periodical tests and other related test related to the examination orientations etc.

2. New academic Programmes Initiated (UG):-

This year Honours in Odia, Mathematics & Physics has been opened. Proposals for concurrence of opening Honours and pass subjects had been sent. Again the ongoing effort for opening of Psychology pass at +3 Degree Arts streams is awaited for making the college a full-fledged one.

3. Innovations in Curricular Design and Transaction:-

The college is affiliated to North Orissa University, Baripada in the state of Odisha. In practice the curriculum is framed & designed by the NOU and the institution has only to follow and implement it into real practice. Practically there is no scope for any innovation in the curriculum. In this regard our institution has taken only the responsibility to chalk out & execute the same objectives of curriculum for effectiveness of the learners and institution at large. However approval has been obtained from the Director of Distance and continuing Education of North Orissa University to open self financing courses like MBA and PGDCA from the session 2011-12 and Govt. of Odisha has accorded approval for the opening of Honours in Odia, Mathematics and Physics 2011. Besides the above the head of the institution is acting as chairman of the Board of studies in the Department of English and some other senior staff members e.g. Sri B. D. Mohantais the member of the board of studies D.D.(Auto) College Keonjhar. They used to propose timely advices to the university/college for ultra-moderating and designing the set norm of curriculum for betterment of the learners and society at large.

4. Interdisciplinary programmes started:-

The college has introduced Environmental Science as the programme on interdisciplinary study.

5. Examination reforms implemented:-

The nature and the norms of the examinations have been duly set up by the university and our college only conducts the examinations as per the scheduled rules & regulations designed & framed by the university concerned. Except implanting the rules and conducting examination, the college has to look into basically the nature & process of examination to be conducted as sound & discipline. The college has no scope for making any sort of reforms except giving certain advices and proposals to the university. In order to update the learners and bring their quality development in academy our college makes on going periodical monthly test & unit test on a very regular basis. But above all we have to follow the university pattern of examination to acquaint the students with the university examinations. .

Computer and internet training are given to the staff and students by the Joint Venture Computer Programme of the college.

College doesn't provide any financial aid to the students. Of course it waives out the development fee and fees for various cultural activities from the poor and needy students. Hence forward college plans to provide some financial aid to such students.

30. Support from the Alumni Association and its Activities:

Alumni meeting was held in the college on 10.12.2012. The alumni extends it's support to the students in counseling and in the organization of various cultural activities etc.

31. Support from the Parent-Teacher Association and its Activities:

The parents-teachers meeting was held on 16.04.2013. The importance of the parents and their involvement in academic development of the students in the institution was ensured by such meeting parents help the institution in a great way by actively motivating the students for attending their classes on regular basis keeping proper discipline & decorum in the campus. Parental inspiration and co-operation was sought for better qualitative development of education of the learners in the institution. The periodical meeting of the parent teacher Association was concerned as per the need of the institution for the purpose of better guidance of the students in the pursuits of the academic development and developing the spirit of awareness about regular attendance for their betterment in the institution.

32. Health services:

Regular practice of Yoga and facilities of gymnasium set up in the college are on continuous process. Every day both Yoga and Gym are practiced in two sessions morning and evening. A blood donation camp was organized at the college in collaboration with a state level NGO. An awareness camp on AIDS “KNOW AIDS NO AIDS” and an Anti Drug Campaign was conducted by the NSS and YRC units of the college. Red-cross unit had also conducted an awareness programme on health and sanitation and on managing road safety.

33. Performance in sports activities:

Department of sports had conducted inter class football, volley and cricket tournaments and the Annual Athletic Meet, 2012. Naresh Kumar Mahanta stood 3rd in the Inter College Athletic Meet, NOU. MilliNaik stood 1st in Discuss throw and 2nd in 100mts hurdles in the Inter College Athletic Meet of NOU. Our college cricket team participated in inter college Cricket tournament.

Besides organizing the sports, sports and athletic department also organizes regular practice of yoga and gym. In the college.

34. Incentives to outstanding sportspersons:

Till now no incentive is given in such cases. But the college plans to provide suitable incentives to the outstanding sportspersons in coming days.

35. Students achievements and awards:

Students Union and the sports unit of the college organized various literary, cultural, sports and athletic competitions among the students. The achievers in such occasions and students achieving extraordinary results are suitably awarded.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counseling Cell:

The Guidance and Counseling Cell of the college guides students choosing the right subjects for them. It also guides them in matters like admission, examinations and their personal problems, if any. Apart from this it counsels the pass out students on higher studies and selection of proper academic institutions

37. Placement services provided to students:

College provides general education. In such case virtually there is no scope for placement except counseling the passed out students on the nature and opportunities of various services. Presently the college is making its plan to introduce some job oriented curriculums like BBA, BCA and MCA etc. in collaboration with IGNOU and North Orissa University. 38. Development programmes for non-teaching staff:


